Regarding Re-opening of Schools for Students of 9th to 12th Classes on Voluntary Basis During Unlock-4 Period Outside the Containment Zones.

In continuation to this Directorate letter of even number dated 19-09-2020, it is once again reiterated that Standard Operating Procedure's circulated by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Directorate of General of Health Services (EMR Division) on 08-09-2020, for partial reopening of Educational Institutions for the Students in the State on a voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their Teachers of their respective Schools, should be followed and adhered strictly in letter & spirit. In addition to aforesaid, it will be the sole responsibility of the Head of the concerned Educational Institution(s) to ensure the following:-

- Educational Institution(s) should be sanitized properly and thereafter also all precautionary measures/steps regarding cleanliness/hygiene are to be taken. At the entry point/ gate of the Educational Institutions, provision of hand wash/ sanitizer should be made. Institutions shall be sanitized / disinfected every day.
- Mechanisms should be developed by the concerned Educational Institution, to maintain the social distancing and to avoid the gathering in the Educational Institution. The CWSN students may be given extra care. All the hostels should be

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cleaned and sanitized and extra care should be given by hostel warden for the cleanliness / sanitization of hostels.

- Signages / Posters should be displayed in the educational institution. Parents of the Students must be asked to provide the masks to their ward.
- Those student having cold / cough/ flue like symptoms should not be allowed in the Educational Institution.

In view of above mentioned, you are directed to take further necessary action in the matter accordingly and these directions/ instructions may also be publicized widely for the information of Students and must be adhered strictly in letter and spirit.

This must be given personal attention and top priority and any

laxity in the matter will be viewed seriously.

SOP for partial reopening of Schools for students of 9th to 12th classes on a voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their teachers: In the context of COVID-19

1. Background

Government of India is following a phase-wise unlocking of activities. In days to come, this would also involve partial resumption of activities in schools for students of classes 9th to 12th on a voluntary basis, for taking guidance from their teachers. This would be allowed from 21st September 2020.

2. Scope

This SOP outlines various generic precautionary measures to be adopted in addition to specific measures to be taken when schools are permitting students (for 9th to 12th class) in the specific context detailed at para-1 above, to prevent spread of COVID-19. All States/UTs are expected to comply with the COVID-19 related guidelines issued by Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.

3. Generic Preventive Measures

The generic preventive measures include simple public health measures that are to be followed to reduce the risk of COVID-19. These measures need to be observed by all (teachers, employees and students) in these places at all times.

These include:

- Physical distancing of at least 6 feet to be followed as far as feasible. i. ii.
- Use of face covers/masks to be made mandatory. lii.

Frequent hand washing with soap (for at least 40-60 seconds) even when hands are not visibly dirty. Use of alcohol-based hand sanitizers (for at least 20 seconds) can be done wherever feasible.

- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth iv. and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/handkerchief/floxed elbow and disposing off used ٧.
- Self-monitoring of health by all and reporting any illness at the earliest. vi.
- Spitting shall be strictly prohibited. vii.
- Installation & use of Aarogya Setu App may be advised wherever feasible.

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- All schools (with classes IX to XII) shall specifically ensure the following arrangements 4.
 - Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged. 1.
 - Students of class 9th to 12th shall be permitted to visit their school on voluntary basis for taking ii. guidance from their teachers. This will be subject to written consent of their parents/guardians. Such visits and teacher - student interaction must be organized in a staggered manner.
- Before opening up of the school 4.1
- a) Planning of reopening of school
 - School outside the containment zones only shall be allowed to open. Further, students, î. . teachers and employees living in containment zones will not be allowed to attend the school. Students, teachers and employees shall also be advised not to visit areas falling within containment zones.
 - Prior to resumption of activities, all work areas intended for teaching/demonstrations etc., ii. including laboratories, other common utility areas shall be sanitized with 1% sodium hypochlorite solution, with particular attention to frequently touched surfaces. iii.
 - Schools that were used as quarantine centres will be properly sanitized and deep cleaned before partial functioning is resumed. Guidelines issued by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for disinfection of common public places including offices may be referred to in this regard)

The concerned teaching and non-teaching employees (up to 50 % of the strength) may be iv. called to schools for online teaching/tele-counselling and related work. v.

Students from class 9th to 12th will have the option of attending the classes remotely/virtually or physically only on a voluntary basis for guidance from their teachers subject to written permission of parent / guardian.

- Instead of biometric attendance alternate arrangements for contactless attendance shall be vi. made by the school administration. vii.
- At all times, the teachers and students shall maintain a physical distancing of 6 feet apart, wherever feasible. Scheduling of activities and sealing plan shall be made accordingly.

vili, . ' Ensure hand washing facilities along with provision of soap. ix.

- For ensuring queue management, inside and outside the premises, specific markings on the floor with a gap of 6 feet may be made. Similarly, physical distancing shall also be maintained in staff rooms, office areas (including reception area), and other places (mess, libraries, cafeterias, etc.) X.
- Weather permitting, outdoor spaces may be utilized for conducting teacher student interactions, keeping in view the safety and security of students and physical distancing protocols.

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Assemblies, sports and events that can lead to overcrowding are strictly prohibited. xi. xii.

The school should display State helpline numbers and also numbers of local health authorities etc. to teachers /students / employees to contact in case of any emergency. xiii.

- For air-conditioning/ventilation, the guidelines of CPWD shall be followed which emphasizes that the temperature setting of all air conditioning devices should be in the range of 24-30° C, relative humidity should be in the range of 40-70%, intake of fresh air should be as much as possible and cross ventilation should be adequate. xiv.
- Lockers of students will remain in use, as long as physical distancing and regular disinfection is maintained. XV. Gymnasiums
 - shall follow MOHEW guidelines (available

- b) Planning and scheduling of activities

All employees who are at higher risk i.e. older employees, pregnant employees and employees who have underlying medical conditions to take extra precautions. They should preferably not be exposed to any front-line work requiring direct contact with the students.

IGOT online modules training course on 'basic (https://diksha.gov.in/igot/explore-course/course/do_313010389971255296164) may be undertaken, * awareness by all employee and students during online interactions or guidance sessions on the first day.

- Availability and management of supplies c)
- Appropriate back-up stock of personal protection items like face covers/masks, visors, hand sanitizers i. etc. shall be made available by management to the teachers and employee. ñ.
- Provide an adequate supply of thermal guns, alcohol wipes or 1% sodium hypochlorite solutions and disposable paper towels, soap, IEC materials on COVID. lii,
- Pulse oximeter to check oxygen saturation levels of any symptomatic person must be arranged. Ensure availability of sufficient covered dustbins and trash cans iv.
- ٧.
- Provision for proper disposal of used personal protective items and general waste in accordance with CPCB guidelines (available at: https://cpcb.nic.in/uploads/Projects/Bio-Medical-Waste/BMW-GUIDELINES-COVID 1.pdf) Housekeeping employee to be informed & trained about norms for waste management & disposal vî.
- 4.2 After opening of the schools

a) At the entry point ١.

Entrance to have mandatory hand hygiene (sanitizer dispenser) and thermal screening provisions. Multiple gates/separate gates, if feasible, should be used for entry and exit.

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at:

- Only asymptomatic persons (teachers, employees and students) to be allowed in the premises. If ii. a teacher/employee/student is found to be symptomatic, he/she should be referred to nearest iii.
- Posters/standees on preventive measures about COVID-19 to be displayed prominently. iv.
- Proper crowd management in the parking lots, in corridors and in elevators duly following physical distancing norms shall be organized. ٧.
- Entry of visitors should be strictly regulated/restricted.
- Conduct of guidance activities in the rooms or open spaces within the school campus b) i.
- Seating arrangement to ensure a distance of 6 feet between chairs, desks etc. ii.
- Staggering of guidance activities to be done, with separate timing slots, to allow for adequate physical distancing and disinfection of classroom premises III.
- The teaching faculty will ensure that they themselves and students wear masks throughout the conduct of the teaching/guidance activities. iv.
- Sharing of items like notebook, pens/pencil, eraser, water bottle etc. amongst students should not be
- c) Conduct of skill based training in workshops/laboratories 1.
- For practical activities in laboratories maximum capacity per session based on redesigned spaces, may be planned and scheduled accordingly. ii.
- Ensure that the equipments have been disinfected, particularly the frequently touched surfaces iii.
- Ensure a floor area of 4m² per person is available for working on equipment/work station. Ensure that members sanitize their hands before and after using training equipment. For such iv purpose hand sanitizer should be provided at workstations/simulation labs etc.
- d)
- Activities in common areas library, mess/canteen, common rooms, gymnasium etc. Physical distancing of 6 feet needs to be maintained i.
- li.
- Persons using the common areas need to use mask/face cover all the time Cafeteria/mess facility, if any within the premises, shall remain closed. lii.
- e) Transportation to and from the institution

If transportation facility is being managed by the school, proper physical distancing, sanitization of buses/other transport vehicles (with 1% sodium hypochlorite) shall be ensured.

- 5. Hygiene and Sanitation
 - Daily cleaning of the floors shall be taken up. i. ii.
- Provision of soap in toilets and hand sanitizers in other common areas in sufficient quantity must iii.
- Cleaning and regular disinfection (using 1% sodium hypochlorite) of frequently touched surfaces (door knobs, elevator buttons, hand rails, chairs, benches, washroom fixtures, etc.) to be made

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mandatory in all class rooms, laboratories, lockers, parking areas, other common areas etc. before beginning of classes and at the end of the day.

- Teaching materials, computers, laptops, printers, shall be disinfected with 70% alcohol wipes.
 Deep, cleaning, of all driphics, and be printers, shall be disinfected with 70% alcohol wipes.
- Deep cleaning of all drinking and hand washing stations, washrooms and lavatories shall be ensured.
 Students and appelored the later of the stations of the stations.
- vi. Students and employee should be advised to dispose of used face covers / masks in separate covered bins placed in classrooms, work stations and other common areas. The same may remain stored in the bins for 3 days and disposed of as dry general solid waste after cutting/shredding.
 vii. Students should not be involved in a second days and disposed of as dry general solid waste after cutting/shredding.

vii. Students should not be involved in any of the cleaning activities for health safety reasons.

6. Risk Communication

 Create awareness to ensure the students do not gather when leaving the school and in their free time.

 Sensitize students, parents, teachers and employees to create awareness on COVID appropriate behavior, as detailed under generic measures above.

iii. If a student, teacher or employee is sick, they should not come to the school and follow necessary protocols in this regard.

7. Psycho-social wellbeing

- i. Ensure regular counselling is done for students and teachers reporting mental health issues such as anxiety and depression.
- It is advisable that teachers, school counsellors and school health workers should work in unison to ensure emotional safety of the students.

- Place the ill person in a room or area where they are isolated from others.
